STREET MARKET ON FRIDAYS

EL COLMADO



This old farmhouse is possibly as old as the neighbourhood or even older. I read once that it is already mentioned in documents from the 14th century. It gives me the impression that it needs to be restored, because it is slowly falling apart. My mother says it is one of the nicest places in the area, and that she used to come here to buy milk when she was a child.

VICENTE ZARAGOZÁ TRAM STOP



I've known this place my whole life as the "Trencadís" House. It belonged to a constructor admirer of Gaudí who, with this fantastic work, put colour in the neighbourhood. For a long time, it was the fruit and vegetable shop "JOVANI" appearing in Pedro Almodóvar's "La mala educación". Now it's a bar that offers tapas based on fish and vegetables film cans, I think. I just hope it keeps its well-groomed appearance for many more years.

CHURCH OF LA ASUNCIÓN et Square,1

This church is a very important building for many people in the neighbourhood. According to the parish priest, it sits on an old hermitage of the 16th century, in which farmers from all over the Vega de Valencia usually celebrated the feasts of the patron saints of Abdón and Senen. The images inside are reproductions, because during the Civil War (1936-1939) the original ones were burned. For me, the greatest curiosity that can be found in the temple is in the presacristy: it is a tombstone from the year 1000,





Every time I pass by, it comes to my mind how life in the neighbourhood has changed. It's like reliving the days of crossing the tracks, the wall of the train, the small old station... Luckily, everything has changed now and, although it looks like people living in Benimaclet are living isolated in a kind of an island, that is not true at all.

BENIMACLET CEMETERY amí de les Fonts

The cemetery is next to the old "Vía Churra", and it is now a route for cyclists and to stroll through the garden. In fact, I go there for a walk every morning and pass by the cemetery. We'll all meet us there in the end! My ancestors are buried there, and every November the 1st I bring flowers to my father. We buy them right there, in the florist's shop on the old road.

Benimaclet's urban orchards are an initiative of the Benimaclet Neighbours' Association, which wanted to recover this garden space for vegetables. It is managed in collaboration with horticulturalists from the area and through a transfer of the City Council. With this initiative, land that had been abandoned for more than fifteen years has been recovered. Among other things, part of the traditional irrigation ditch system has been restored. It is a composting point too and it promotes organic farming and community work. We love it and, in fact, we share a small plot with some friends. We've met a lot of people from the neighbourhood there, and Alex has a great time running after chickens.

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I am FERRAN, I'm 20 years old and I come from Pego, the last town of Alicante, close to Valencia. I share an apartment with two other mates, who also come from the Safor region. I study computer science and they do Fine Arts and are artists I like this very much, because they have made our old flat full of colour, paintings, sculptures... and they also update me on the social and cultural life of the neighbourhood. The thing I like most about Benimaclet is the location (it is very close to university), and the fact that I don't pay too much for the rent. Although it looks like a village, there's a lot to do here... It's like a bubble which I barely leave and I don't even need to!







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PHOTOGRAPHY SCHOOLS

LOS TALLERES

For those who like innovation, design and technological creation, we're lucky to have places for all this in Benimaclet. It's all about , spaces where you can blow your mind. There are workshop spaces available, as well as multitude of materials (carboards, wood, methacrylate, fabrics...), tools (laser cutting, milling machines, 3D printers, bookbinding, etc.), and the necessary advice to help you to make your designs come true. I do like them a lot. Just some examples: I love to stop by ARCHICERCLE, which is at Utiel Street, 6 to see what they are doing; or by EL LABORATORIO DE FABRICACIÓN, at Poet Carles Salvador, 8 where they have created, in cooperation with LAS NAVES (a cultural entity depending on the City Council of Valencia), an innovation project called FABRICA BARRI (http://fabricabarri.com/).



FIARE BANCA ÉTICA C/ Utiel, 16 w.fiarebancaetica.coop



I first found Fiare's Territorial Initiative Group through ACOEC, the Association for Cooperation between Communities, which is their information point. There was nothing like this in Pego and I find this idea of a credit union absolutely interesting. ACOEC also organizes social and international cooperation activities.



For me, it's the main entrance to get into the neighbourhood. Everv Sunday night there is a horde of students coming from the North Train Station after visiting their families during the weekend. This station is perfect to go anywhere, since you can also take the tram to the university, to El Cabanyal and the beach, or to l' horta nord or Pont de Fusta.

EL GLOP Benimaclet Square, 3

Legendary in the neighbourhood. It has been and the meeting point of several generations of students, and it still is. What I like the most is the special good vibes in the atmosphere and also that everyone who comes here does it with to just have a good time. It is a real reference for any student who has passed through Valencia, you just need to ask!

The CIM is an association where music has been taught since 1910: playing instruments, musical language, musicology... They also have a choir, a rondalla, a band and an orchestra. On the ground floor they serve breakfast, lunch, meals... I love it. And, of course, they organize a lot of activities for both children and adults.

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SAN MIGUEL DE LOS REYES Constitución, 284

Although it is outside the neighbourhood, a visit to this 16th century Renaissance building is a must for history and heritage lovers. Thousands of Republican supporters were imprisoned there and, after being refurbished in 1999, it became the headquarters of the Valencian Library. Free guided tours are organised on Saturdays and Sundays at 12:00 and 13:00 and there is no need to register in advance. It's worth a trip to see it!



THE WATER TANK d C/ Mistral

This deposit has witness value for Benimaclet neighbours, who have turned it into an urban icon. The Company of Trams and Valencian Railways ordered to build it to supply employees nearby houses. It is currently a reminder of how urban services have been changing. For me, it's a vestige that speaks of the neighbourhood's past.

MOLÍ FARINÓS



It is a landmark in the neighbourhood: its design, its materiality, its building process and management make it a very unique residential building. It was conceived by the architect Antonio Cortés Ferrando and built in 1986 by the cooperative called the same name. All dwellings are different. In addition, this building has many common areas such as elevated gardens, a swimming pool and an indoor track for exercise without having to get out of it. CÍRCULO THEATRE C/ Prudenci Alcón i Mateu, 3 http://teatrocirculo.com/

It is a small theatre, whose company usually produces contemporary plays with strong social content. It is great to have such a theatre next door. In addition, they have discounts for students and special prices on weekdays.

JABONERÍA C/ Murta, 2

Occupying the current social services centre, there was the former Viguer soap factory. The streets Utiel and Mistral did not exist at that time and the soap factory was one of the limits of the so-called Poblado de Benimaclet.

BOOKSHOP-CAFE "EL CHICO OSTRA" C/ Músico Belando, 15 http://chicoostra.com/



I think it's been open since 2010. It's a quiet and pleasant place to have a drink late in the afternoon or in the evening, surrounded by second-hand books and paintings of the exhibition at the time. MIRAMAR TOWER Av Catalunva and Av. Tarongers



This observation deck and all its surroundings have turned into a sad tribute to the late urban wastefulness period. It was built with the intention to spot the Valencia coastline, but it ended up being an expensive roundabout, which didn't meet all the leisure expectations. Today, all fountains, gardens and facilities are abandoned and there's no access to the viewpoint. It certainly reminds us that we are not only supposed to do things, but also to think about them before. And without losing sight of the maintenance.
