LA MARINA Dock of Valencia

It brings me back many memories, the work at the port was what fed many people in the neighbourhood. In the past, many neighbours sailed or worked in the port, in the fish market, sewing nets... Of course it is no longer the same. Fishing is almost symbolic and the port has grown a lot to the south, where you can see large boats loaded with colourful containers. So the dock is kept for other things. Times change, but people continue going for a walk around just like when I was young, only now there are many restaurants, bars and places to dance ... there is everything here.

There is a very beautiful ceramic altarpiece on the façade, which I believe is protected by the Town Hall. The figure of the patron saint of Canyamelar, the Santísimo Cristo de los Afligidos, is inside. What impresses me most about the interior is the vault of the presbytery.

EL CABANYAL MARKET HALL



I go on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays as soon as it is open, because it is not so crowded and I am more relaxed. You can find all the neighbours there. Sometimes we start gossiping, talking about how the neighbourhood is while waiting for fresh fish to be taken out... It is easy to lose track of time, and then I have to hurry to prepare lunch to have time to pick up my grandchildren at school.

When my family from out of Valencia is here to visit, I always take them there to have a snack before going for a long walk.

There are a lot of places in the neighbourhood where you can get some good mussles to cook them at home or for you to eat in a restaurant. It's one of the luxuries of living near the beach, I always tell my friends!

THE LONJA DE PESCADORES OF LA MARINA AUXILIANTE C/ Eugenia Viñes, 133-171

Lonja de Pescadores, which means fishermen's market, was built by a society of boat skippers between 1904 and 1909. They gathered together to help each other and they also built this building for the sale of fish. My grandfather was a member of that society. As soon as it was finished, it was used as a Red Cross hospital during the African war (1921-1927). Then it was turned into a fishermen's market, but its warehouses were converted into fishermen's houses. In the Civil War (1936-1939) it was used as a prison. Nowadays, many people live there and ask for help to renovate the building.

SEAFRONT PROMENADE



Sometimes I sit on the promenade, look at the horizon and forget that we are by the sea. I remember my husband. There are a lot of people in summer, too many for my liking, but it's a wonder in the winter sunny days. In September, one of the things I like the most is going down to the Promenade and watch the families having dinner there. They set their own chairs and tables on, which they bring from home. It's a very nice picture.

BALNEARIO LAS ARENAS

CHURCH OF LOS ÁNGELES Plaza de la Iglesia de los Ángeles

I love the history behind this church because it represents the importance of the sailor past of this neighbourhood like almost nowhere else. One of the towers of this church used to serve as a lighthouse for fishermen and sailors. It's very beautiful, but I like the Iglesia del Rosario interior better. Luckily, only few of the altarpieces inside were destroyed during the Great Flood of 1957; it could have been a lot worse.



I'm signed up for some kind of cultural sessions in the parish in which the history of this church is explained. The girl who explains it is wonderful; she has a degree in Fine Arts. She told us that it is a Neoclassical building of Latin cross plan, with a dome that reaches a height of 25 meters. She also told us the story of the image of the Santísimo Cristo del Grao, which is inside the Chapel. It is said that it arrived floating by the sea and on a ladder on August 15th, 1411.

CASA DELS BOUS

At the end of the XIX century, the fishermen's guild of "La Marina Auxiliante" was given the concession of these lands to build spaces destined to oxen stable, as well as to launch and beach fishing boats. In recent years, various collectives and associations have organized activities in it, from exhibitions of contemporary art and crafts to music and theatre performances. It is an important place in the memory of the neighbourhood.

BAR CABANYAL





I like to go there, in front of the Cabanyal Market Hall, to have ΕI sardines and fried fish. Fish is bought at the market freshly and then cooked at the bar. It's very well priced and the people running it are very nice.

This mill was in operation for over a century. It has been restored and is now a museum. You can see how the grains are separated from the shell, bleached and selected. If you visit the museum with children, you can download cards from its website with information and activities adapted to different ages. I go every year with my nephews and ... They love it! Next door is the Museum of the Semana Santa Marinera.



EL CASINET C/ José Benlliure, 272

J. B. Gosálvez, a famous architect from the neighbourhood, built this building in 1909 as the headquarters of the worker cooperative "El Progreso Pescador". Then, after merging with "La Unión de Pescadores", part of the building was dedicated to socio-cultural activities, and in 1926 the music band "Sociedad Musical Unión de Pescadores" (SMUP) was established there up until today. They still own the building, keeping the activity of this neighbourhood's historic icon.

TORRE MIRAMAR C/ Escalante, 205

I think that there is only this tower left along with the ones in the Reina Street and the Cabanyal Market Hall. Right now it has become a four unit residence building but, as it seems, from these towers the fishermen watched over the state of the sea and the boat masters checked when they arrived at the beach... The traditional achitecture of these neighbourhoods shows unique tipologies in which the ceramic provides a special personality.

EL MUSICAL THEATRE (TEM)

It has a very varied programme: dance, theatre, performances... they even hold workshops with neighbours. I've already participated in some plays here and the seating capacity was always full. It's a theatre that transmits me a special feeling. Besides, the building is really pretty.

SHIPYARDS laza de Juan Antonio Benlliure

I try not to miss any exhibit. It's a fabulous place! I love the space there. The shipyards were built at the end of the 14th century for the manufacture, storage and repair of boats, but were later used as artillery arsenal and later even as a warehouse for wheat and cereals. Later on, in 1949, they were declared Historical Artistic Monument. National



LA COL·LECTIVA C/ Cura Planelles, 2 fb: LaCollectivaCabanyal

The building, which was once a Popular University, is now runned by a group of associations very committed with the neighbourhood. It is a shame that the owners decided to sell it, I don't know what the associations which work there will do now...





I like coming to skateboard here, under the decks of the port sheds. I like to move freely between these Art Nouveau structures, which were formerly connected to the Grau Station (1852), which was the first one built in Valencia and was used to store produce from the orchard. Now a lot of people come here to walk around. I would like this area to be pedatonized and to be full of many, many trees!

EL CABANYAL AND LA MALVARROSA BEACHES From the port to the Patacona beach



It seems to me that the beach is the greatest meeting point of this neighbourhood. In summer, the neighbourhood is joined by people coming from the city and a lot of tourists. I especially like it when the summer cinema is set up on the beach, and people get off with their chairs to watch movies while having dinner with friends or family. It also has charm in winter: I love to go down at night to talk to the fishermen who are throwing the rod on the shore. I would never fish, but I could sit there and listen to the sea all night long too.
